"BCP" is the Book of Common Prayer. The + symbol indicates an appropriate time to make the sign of the Cross. Some bow while saying the italicized words in the Nicene Creed and when the Name of Jesus is said. These optional practices are noted as a convenience for those who choose to do so.

Opening Hymn

Summary of the Law *Matthew 22:37-40*

Celebrant Hear what our Lord Jesus Christ tells us: "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Confession of Sin *(Confession is from Enriching Our Worship 1)*

Celebrant Dearly beloved, we have come together in the presence of Almighty God our creator, to give praise, to hear God's holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

Silence is kept

Celebrant & People God of all mercy, we confess that we have sinned against you, opposing your will in our lives. We have denied your goodness in each other, in ourselves, and in the world you have created. We repent of the evil that enslaves us, the evil we have done, and the evil done on our behalf. Forgive, restore, and strengthen us through our Savior Jesus Christ, that we may abide in your love and serve only your will. *Amen.*

Absolution

Celebrant Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through the grace of *Jesus Christ*, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen*
